Bulgaria - Land of Roses

As Portland is known as the Rose City, Bulgaria is called the Land of Roses being one of the largest producers of rose oil in the world. Called



Bulgarian Rose Oil or Rose Otto, it is considered one of the finest essential oils. The oil is extracted from the petals of the Bulgarian Rose Damascena.

"Born" in Damascus, Syria, Rosa Damascena was brought to Bulgarian lands during the 17the century. Bulgaria then was part of the Ottoman Empire. This full of aroma rose found

a second home in Bulgaria. It gave its name to a whole region - The Rose valley of Bulgaria. Extending more than 80 miles along the Balkan mountain range, the Rose valley is surrounded by two mountains, which stop the cold winds in the wintertime and help create a specific climate. The combination of several factors makes this region a unique place for growing this sort of rose. The oil extracted from it is the best quality in the world, so the Valley of Roses became a center of rose oil production and export for centuries.

The Rose Valley has also always been the center stage for the colorful age-old Festival of Roses. This traditional festival is a symbol of the rose industry and its influence on the culture, spirit and lifestyle of the region. The Bulgarian Rose Festival is celebrated with folk songs and dances on the first Sunday in June, at the start of the rose harvest in the Rose Valley.

One of the main attractions is the "kukeri" dance - masked dancers performing a traditional pagan dance. Other interesting events at the festival are the election and coronation of the most beautiful girl - the "Queen Rose"; a traditional harvest ritual performed in the rose gardens and a parade along the streets of the city. If the Portland Rose Festival weren't at the same time



it would be fun to have a Royal Rosarian contingent marching in their parade.

Fall Rose Pruning
