

Sad News in the Realm of Rosaria

Former First Lady Lee Ann Gadilauskas, beloved wife of 2011 Prime Minister Ray Hanson, passed away January 2 after a recent diagnosis of an aggressive form of cancer. She was 61.

Those who knew her well knew that when she and Ray first met in Tillamook in 1985 they were an example of "opposites attract." Lee Ann was a liberal feminist free spirit. Ray was conservative and part of the

establishment, owning a soft drink distributorship. Lee Ann's effect over the years was to liberalize Ray, something he came to greatly appreciate.

What everyone observed is a couple deeply in love who did almost everything together. They worked together in their business brokerage and business valuation firm. They did lots of travel including their Prime Minister's Trip to Greece in fall 2010. And they served together as the Royal Rosarians' First Couple in 2010-11, often riding our Traveling Float.

Lee Ann graduated from Humbolt State University with a Masters Degree in theater direction. She worked as a manager for the Job Corps and Job Training Partnership Act in Tillamook, as an Administrative Manager for **Clackamas County Mental** Health, and then became a sought-after grant writer who secured funding for many non-profits. Working with Ray, Lee Ann trained to become a business valuation specialist and became a member of the Institute of Business Appraisers.

Lee Ann was a board member of Clackamas Repertory Theater, a member of Lake Oswego



Rotary Club, and a volunteer with Loaves and Fishes. She is survived by Duke Ray Hanson, two children and three grandchildren.
