# **Centennial Time Capsule**

The Time Capsule Centennial Committee is asking all Royal Rosarians for suggestions as to what they would like to see in the time capsule sealed box. The time capsule is a double-walled, stainless steel hermetically sealed box, 12 inches wide by 16 inches long by 6 inches deep.

The centennial time capsule will be placed beneath the bronze identification plaque in the concrete base of the new Royal Rosarian statue in the Rosarian Rose Garden at the International Rose Test Garden in Washington Park. The time capsule will be sealed and set in the base of the statue August 12, 2012 during the Day in the Park Centennial Celebration.

Preliminary suggestions have included such items as: the current Roster, the Royal Rosarian History Book, the Centennial Activities List, the Royal Rosarian Centennial Christmas Ornament and the Rosarian group photo taken in the Fall of 2011. Items must be sized to fit within the box dimensions and be able to last the one hundred years. Not knowing the technological advances of that time period, things like CD's are probably not a good idea.

Sheets for listing suggestions will be on the tables at the Membership Meetings throughout the year. All items should be turned in to the Time Capsule Committee by July 12, 2012. ### Prime Minister's Message

First Lady Roxanne and I spent six days in Kaohsiung as part of the Portland Kaohsiung Sister City Association Goodwill Delegation. Queen Lamarra Haynes and Teri Boyles-Atherton were also a part of the delegation. While we were there we were shown the hospitality of the Taiwanese people. They made sure we had great lunches and dinners everyday in various traditional and modern venues.





We toured around the city by bus for the first three days and then began a series of receptions and dinners. At the mayor's lunch on Sunday, the city presented Portland Kaohsiung Sister City Association with two dragon boats.

We were told that Portland is the only place where boats with the large dragon head like this are raced. The boats are valued at around \$20,000 each. They are being built now, and will be shipped to Portland in the spring. While we were there, we were able to see a model of the boats.

On Sunday night, the delegations were honored to be called up on stage to join the mayor in opening the City's Lantern Festival. This was a televised event with thousands in attendance. On Tuesday night we were hosted by the City Council at a dinner. Our trip was certainly one that we will always cherish as a special part of this fantastic year.


### **2013 Prime Minister's Trip Informational Meeting**
