Annual Election Coming Up June 11

The annual election meeting of the Royal Rosarians will take place Thursday, June 11 at the DoubleTree Hotel, Portland at 6:30 p.m.

This year there are 16 candidates for nine open positions on Council. There are two candidates for Secretary of State.

All Rosarians must register at the voting table to receive their ballot. Once completed the ballots are to be placed in the ballot box. Vote for a maximum of nine candidates for Council. A ballot with more than nine selections for Council will not be counted. Similarly, each ballot must indicate a maximum selection of two candidates for the Foundation Board positions. This first ballot voting will end at 6:30 p.m. and ballots will be counted immediately thereafter. Rosarians will vote for Council and Foundation candidates at the outset, but not candidates for the Secretary of State position. After the the initial votes are tallied, a separate ballot will then be distributed for the Secretary of State position. (This process resulted from an interpretation of the Edict previously. It addresses a concern voiced in past years that no votes for Secretary of State candidates are "wasted" because the SOS candidate failed to get elected to Council, which is a qualification to be Secretary of State.)

Those who attend the Election meeting only for the purpose of voting will want to plan to remain in attendance after the Council election at 6:30 so that they can vote in the Secretary of State election after the Council ballots are counted.

For new Rosarians, the person elected Secretary of State in June is then in line to become our 2018 Prime Minister.

Keep in mind that there is no proxy voting and no absentee voting. You must be present to vote.

Also at this meeting will be the election of two Rosarians to the Board of Directors of our Rosarian Foundation. There are three candidates for these two positions and their submitted information is set forth below. Remember: all Rosarians are members of the Royal Rosarian Foundation and are entitled to vote.

Immediately below is information submitted by each candidate. The questions were put to Council and Secretary of State candidates by Royal Regent Mark Smith, who chairs the Nominating Committee. The Foundation question was put to Board candidates by Foundation President Korrie Hoeckendorf. The submissions of each candidate have not been edited. They are printed as submitted. The photos below of Rosarian candidates were submitted by the candidates (or, if a candidate didn't submit a photo, the Royal Regent may have used the Roster photo).

The first two candidates are running for Secretary of State (Baker and McIntyre, in alphabetical order) as well as for re-election to Council. Following these two candidates are the other 14 candidates for Council. Remember that there are nine positions on Council for which these 16 candidates are running.

Below the Council candidates are the three candidates for two positions on the Foundation board.


Sir Knight John Santos

I have been fortunate and found it very rewarding to have held several positions as a past council member. Elected by the membership, I have held the following positions:






<u>Master of Ceremonies</u> -Collaborated and assisted the auction planning committee on a very successful celebration.

Currently, I am serving as a <u>Foundation Board Member</u> and am on the <u>Finance Budgeting</u> <u>Committee</u> for the Foundation.





Sir Knight Doug Zimmerman


Describe your most satisfying roles and responsibilities to date in the Royal Rosarians.
