Prime Minister Selects Four Out-of-Town Trips

Tips with the Royal Update-

We've received quite a number of thanks for the Royal Update--we appreciate your feedback. More than 202 people opened and read the last issue of the Royal Update and a couple had questions. Here they are:

- 1) One reader (a Duke who shall remain anonymous) emailed asking us to add his spouse to the Royal Update mailing list. We're happy to add anyone who's a friend of Rosaria but it's not necessary to contact the editors; it's easy for you to add someone yourself. At the bottom of each Royal Update is a "Join" button next to which you can insert the new recipient's email address, then click the "Join" button. It's that easy! And remember: our capacity is virtually unlimited and emailing is as close to free as communications get.
- 2) One Rosarian emailed asking about printing the Royal Update on 8 1/2 by 11 paper. Keeping in mind that this is an electronic newsletter, designed for delivery by email, printing it is a bit like printing the New York Times, USA Today or other electronic content from a web site--it may not format and print perfectly on letter-size paper

because it is, after all, a 21st Century electronic e-mail newsletter. But it can be done--we print about two dozen copies of the Royal Update to snail mail to our older members and widows who don't use email. Here's a tip on how to best print the Royal Update: At the top where it asks if you are having trouble viewing this email, click here. When the next view opens, right click and choose the print option. Continue as normal to print. You will receive a very viewable and readable hard copy of the Update with an occasional odd break in a picture or in text.
