President's Remarks

"How do we accommodate the 30-year old businessperson raising a family? Well, for one thing we could pay less attention to attendance. My question isn't 'How many meetings did you make?' It's 'How are you making a difference in your community?" This is another quote from past RI president John Germ who is a big supporter of more flexibility in many Rotary matters. Not surprisingly, current RI president Ian Riseley echoes the same message. "Rotary must do more to welcome younger people who face a number of competing demands. They are interested in service and eager to do good, but they need options. We need to offer them an involvement that doesn't waste their time." Those comments are based on the realization that society has changed dramatically fast in recent decades and Rotary needs to adapt swiftly to "stay in the business".

To do so, the legal framework was provided by the Council on Legislation in 2016 that granted clubs more freedom in determining their meeting schedule and membership. The first measure allows clubs to decide to vary their meeting times, whether to meet online or in person, and when to cancel a meeting, as long as they meet at least twice a month. The second allows clubs flexibility in choosing their membership rules and requirements.

Interestingly enough, RI president-elect Barry Rassin seems to be open for even bigger changes. In a recent interview he declared: "Some of the traditions from weekly club meetings could go." Bang!

Last Week: Emily Cowan, Executive Director PEC Chamber of Commerce

The Chamber was formed in 1905 as Quinte Isle Tourism mandated to promote tourism. Eventually evolved into Chamber of Commerce.

Up until 2016, promoted tourism on behalf of PEC. Published PEC County Red Map, offered fuel discounts for members, member to member discounts.

A shift in their mandate to County Workforce Partnership focusing on staff retention with development of HR Tool Kit.

Other issues of focus include mental health, food insecurity and training skills.

Soon they will be moving from 116 to 321 Main St., Picton providing more space to create new resources for entrepreneurs.

Annual membership fees are \$232 + tax per member.

<u>County Workforce Partnership</u> formed in July 2017, The Prince Edward Learning Centre, PEC Chamber of Commerce, Career Edge, Community Development Dept. and Loyalist College Training & Knowledge Centre applied for a Sector Planning Partnership Grant.

The 5 aforementioned organizations have formed the County Workforce Partnership (CWP), which will become a standing committee of the PEC Chamber of Commerce.
