Last Week: Mayor Robert Quaiff - A Year in Review

The Mayor wished to congratulate the County and the community for their response to the high water flooding in the spring.

Council has put together a workable strategic plan and a new framework for growth in The County. Growth is seen as coming from the Professional & medical sectors.

The Mayor noted that we have a shortage of affordable housing. Council has set aside \$250,000 towards improving housing access. The County is looking at Pinecrest School as a possible solution.

He also noted that approval of stage 1 of the new hospital plan is nearing acceptance by the SELHIN and the Ministry of Health and Long term care.

Also the Mayor commented on the Royal Visit and noted that the sun came out just in time for their arrival.

In response to a question, the Mayor admitted that no action is happening on the old Duke Dome and the variety store property.
