Last Meeting: Neil Carbone, Director of Community Development-PEC

The Community Development Department has a broad mandate, not only leading Community Development but working with the newly created Community and Economic Development Commission (CEDC) to achieve Council's High Level Strategic Priorities. The Community Economic Development Commission recently completed the Strategic Plan.

Specifically, the Community Development Department will: Provide input for the Corporate Strategic Plan Implement a one window approach for development proposals

Use culture & heritage assets as economic drivers Oversee grants and applications, including the Municipal Community Grant Programs over \$5,000. Manage County real estate sales and leasing Provide assistance to small businesses including business retention and expansion

We work in collaboration with our Development Services Group (Building & Planning) to provide investors and the public, a one-window approach to access municipal services relating to economic and community development.

Some of the issues Neil identified for Wellington include: - Affordable housing – a task force has been established and \$250,000 seed money provided to encourage development.

- Parking challenges

- Convenience Store property-a public meeting will be held on May 18th to explore options. At its June meeting, Council will consider ideas and decide on a solution. Options to be considered include rebuild, retain, open space. A recent engineering report says the structure is sound so retaining the current structure may be the most cost effective solution.
