President's Remarks

March 12 to 18 is celebrated as World Rotaract Week. And more importantly, this year marks the 50th anniversary for Rotaract. What began as a Rotary International youth program in 1968 has grown into a major Rotary-sponsored organization of over 10,000 clubs spread around the world with close to 300,000 members. Not surprisingly, it is a service, leadership, professional and community service organization for young men and women between the ages 18-30 (membership will end upon reaching 31 years of age). Rotaract focuses on the development of young adults as leaders in their communities and workplaces. Clubs around the world also take part in international service projects, in a global effort to bring peace and international understanding to the world. "Rotaract" stands for "Rotary in Action", although the name originally comes from a combination of "Rotary" and "Interact" (International + Action), the high school level program created by Rotary International in 1962.

Most Rotaract activities take place at the club level. Clubs hold formal meetings which feature speakers, special outings, social activities, discussions or visits to other clubs. Club members get together for service project work, social events, or professional/leadership development workshops. To my personal knowledge, most Rotaract clubs can be found in or close to universities and colleges.

With all the description above it might come as a surprise that only a handful of Rotaractors make the transition to a regular Rotary club once their membership expires. The reasons shall not be discussed today.
