This year 9 students will travel abroad. Net costs range from \$7,000 to \$8,500 per student.

Kristen Nash spoke briefly about her experience with a year in Japan in 2005 and she found the year quite challenging. Kristen is now involved in the District Youth Exchange Committee.

Jeremy was the second student and he talked about his year in Brazil. He returned two years ago. They spent their orientation week at a local resort with 63 exchange students.
