President's Remarks

I don't know if everyone is aware that in Rotary, each month is dedicated to a subject. In January, we are celebrating "Vocational Service Month". While reading through some of the obvious literature (newsletter, websites, etc.) and digging a little bit deeper into the subject, I came across a small but very interesting handbook called An Introduction to Vocational Service. It deals with various topics that fall within the main topic of vocational service, such as "The Object of Rotary", "The Concept of Vocational Service", "Classification", "Integrity and Ethics" and "Vocational Training and Professional Development".

To most of you this might sound awfully boring and very dry (I guess the latter wouldn't be a problem while discussing a white wine standing at a local winery!). But the handbook also reveals some interesting facts about Rotary no one has told me before. Two examples:

- a) The name "Rotary" originated with the practice of rotating meeting sites among members' places of business.
- b) The Four-Way Test was conceived in 1932 by businessman Herbert J. Taylor, a member of the Rotary Club of Chicago who served as Rotary International president in 1954-55. Having taken on the task of saving a company from bankruptcy, Taylor developed the test as an ethical guide to follow in all business matters. The company's survival was credited to this simple philosophy. Adopted by Rotary International in 1934, The Four-Way Test remains an essential standard against which Rotarians measure ethical behavior.
