Each year, Rotary selects up to 100 professionals from around the world to receive fellowships (tuition and fees, room and board, round-trip transportation, and all internship and field-study expenses) to study at one of the peace centers which are located in:

- * Duke University and University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, USA
- * International Christian University, Tokyo, Japan
- * University of Bradford, Bradford, England
- * University of Queensland, Brisbane, Australia
- * Uppsala University, Uppsala, Sweden
- * Chulalongkorn University, Bangkok, Thailand

Through academic training, practice, and global networking opportunities, the Rotary Peace Centers program develops leaders who become catalysts for peace and conflict prevention and resolution. Many of them are serving as leaders at international organizations or have started their own foundations.


As we all know: an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure!
