Last Week - Art Chamberlain-Shelterbox

Art is member of Campbellford Rotary and a volunteer and ambassador for [Shelter Box Canada](http://ShelterBoxCanada.org). Providing shelter in a box for deployment to people in need.

Last year, almost 85 million people around the world were made homeless by natural disaster and conflict. We're working to change this by providing emergency shelter and tools for families robbed of their homes by disaster. We're transforming despair into hope.

We deliver the essentials people need to begin rebuilding their lives in the aftermath of a disaster.

Each disaster is different, and so is every community. We don't believe that one size fits all, so we make considered assessments to provide the exact support that gives people the hope and the power to transform their own lives.

The aid we supply comes in the form of shelter boxes and shelter kits. Shelter boxes contain family-sized tents specially designed to withstand the elements and to provide people with temporary. Our shelter kits contain all of the essential tools people need to start repairing and rebuilding homes straight away.

Our kits and boxes contain the items that help transform shelter into a home, like cooking sets, solar lights and activity sets for children.

We test and evaluate all of the aid we provide by talking to, and learning from, the families who use it. This fuels us to be innovative and to continue evolving.

Rotarians can make a single donation or a monthly legacy. Rotary are 43% of total donations.
