More than 300 "golfers" — outfitted with clubs, hockey sticks, tennis rackets and "anything else that can propel a tennis ball" - braved temperatures of 15 degrees Farenheit on a frozen lake to raise about \$24,000 for a local food pantry, says Ken Galloway of the Rotary Club of White Bear Lake, Minnesota, which organized the 18-hole Bear'ly Open tournament and community dance. The pantry serves about 500 families each month. The February contest—now a fixture of the St. Paul Winter Carnival—exceeded revenue expectations as the club leveraged interest in the Super Bowl, held the following day in nearby Minneapolis.

CLASSIFICATION: The MN ReCyclery, Lynn Kapaun and Jim Muellner

Standing in for Jim Muellner, Lynn Kapaun spoke about the MN ReCyclery, an organization composed of nine volunteers who accept donated bicycles, repair them and provide them for a small cost or free of charge to individuals in need throughout Minnesota. Recipients are identified are identified through churches, schools and social service agencies. Last year the group processed 250 bicycles at a cost of \$15 to \$25. While they prefer to have the recipients pay \$10 to \$15 for the bike to have a sense of ownership, they are provided free if the person is unable to pay. They pride themselves in providing the service with near zero waste. Parts from non-repairable bicycles are used to repair other bikes and unusable parts are given to artists or sold as scrap metal. Donated bicycles may be dropped off at the garage of the house west of Cup N Cone.

She started the organization, patterned after the renowned El Sistema music for social change, for the purpose of empowering youth with life skills through music, service and community. Working with St. Paul public schools, children in grades 2 through 8th in a 250 square block area on the north side of St. Paul known as the St. Paul Promise Neighborhood are invited to join the group's choir and music program. Many of those who enter are shy and lack self esteem and are unable to participate in other extra-curricular activities due to cost and transportation barriers. In addition to the choral activities to group forms a strong sense of belonging and community where strong friendships are formed in a safe and supportive environment.

Beyond its relationship with St. Paul Schools, the group collaborates with the Minnesota Orchestra. Members of the Orchestra volunteer to mentor students in music and participate in some of their concerts. !00 percent of the youth sing solo in front of their peers and their teachers report increases in their skills and self esteem. A recent highlight was singing at the Super Bowl in addition to other concerts throughout the Twin Cities.
