<u>Program:</u> Patty Hall presents: Brian Singer of Project Zawadi

Brian has a history as a Peace Corps volunteer and math instructor. He's now putting both to use — service and education — through his mission to sponsor students in Tanzania, Africa. Project Zawadi is focused on three elements: student sponsorship, model schools and teacher training. Brian spoke of the desperate needs to upgrade conditions for teachers AND students. Project Zawadi selects and supports the neediest, from secondgraders to master's students — with a pledge to continue the support if the students stay committed, too. The project has zeroed in on six schools to give intensive support over five-year periods. The support will include some of what the nonprofit already does: building classrooms and dorms, providing teacher training, getting students' input, getting parents more involved. Regarding teacher training, the project has created a handbook and trained more than 300 teachers with it. It also is working on a model that uses instructional videos — E-learning — that could be a model for teaching training across the country. Lastly, Brian talked about a side project — a safari business — that has created jobs for locals and also fed financial support back to Project Zawadi.
