Here Comes the Sun!

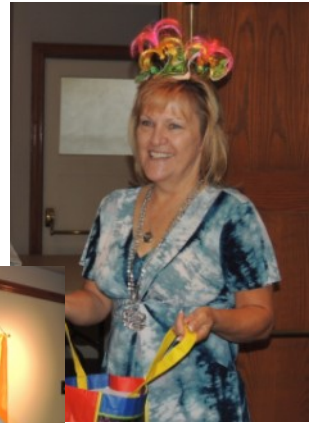


January was a tough month for the club but President Ginny sees brighter days ahead after being inspired Tony and Rocky's recovery.

Character Counts by Reverend Dr. Lew Fry “God’s Plan to Heal the World”

Reverend Dr. Lew Fry had a special Character Counts speech dedicated to Rocky Rhodes. If we look at our world today, it's easy to become cynical with all the lying, cheating, corruption and poverty. Lew tells the story of a disillusioned man troubled by all the pain and misery. The man became frustrated and raised his voice, “Lord, how can you allow all this corruption and suffering and do nothing?”

Then someone behind him whispered, “He didn’t do nothing, He made you.”

“What a profound insight and daunting responsibility it is to realize that you are the instrument of reform, that your courage, compassion, and creativity in your own sphere of influence can set into motion a ripple effect of healing actions and attitudes to make a better world.”

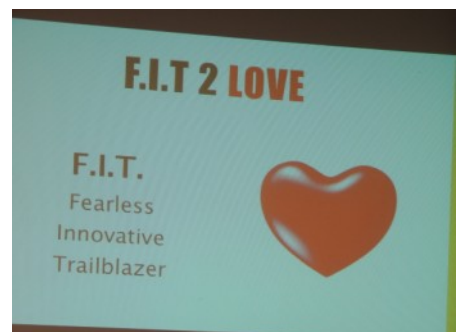
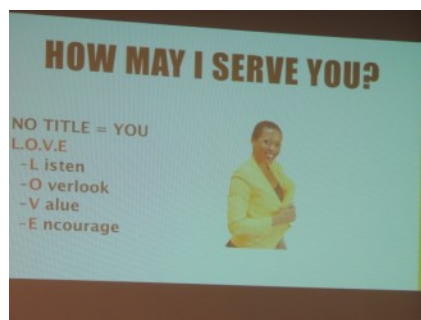


