

Virginia's Demotion Party

John Jones

U.S. Department of Energy

Clean up at the Santa Susana Field Laboratory

DOE's Responsibility of Area IV



Tristan brought the Federal Project Director from the Department of Energy to talk about the clean up of the Santa Susanna Field Laboratory. John Jones is an engineer from Tennessee after working at nuclear test sights in Tennessee and Nevada. He comes to clean up the Department of Energy's responsibilities and he is confident to live with his family in Simi Valley near the laboratory. NASA and Boeing are also responsible for the Santa Susana site.

There was an "incident" in the 1950s in which radioactive material was released into the air. In addition, there was carcinogenic chemicals used by the lab to manufacture and service the rocket engines that have been exposed to the environment. The area has since been closed and remediation efforts taken place.

Mr. Jones states the laboratory and surrounding area have been extensively studied and sampled. Many insightful and inquiring questions came from club members. An Environmental Impact State will soon be released and the public can scrutinize and give opinions after the release. He estimates the time of completion of the clean up is a highly variable ten years.




