Speaker Chuck Jelloian Gives the Behind Scenes Scoop on Building the Ronald Reagan Library

Chuck Jelloian served as the first Director of the Ronald Reagan Presidential Foundation. He started working for President Reagan at the young age of 28. Chuck was a major player in the building of the library. He shared the story of how President Reagan wanted to push the dynamite plunger to start construction—the Secret Service didn't

think that was such a great idea. No government funds were used to build the library, \$100 million dollars in private funds were raised. Margaret Thatcher—one of Reagan's close friends visited the library while it was under construction. Originally, the Berlin Wall was going to be inside ... Reagan prevailed and got his way...getting the Wall moved to outside, not far from his burial site. It took three years to complete construction of the library, which includes an equestrian tunnel that gets very little use.

- The Library opened on November 4, 1991
- Five Presidents and six First Ladies attended
- Bush 41 allowed architects to visit the Oval Office so they could get exact measurements of the office for the Library
- The day after the official opening of the Library a Ventura County Community Day was held—Ronald and Nancy Reagan attended and was there all day
- There are 100,000 gifts stored in the basement of the Library, plus an archive of films
- Little known fact—President Reagan LOVED chocolate chip cookies more than Jelly Bellys
