

Workforce Education Coalition Marybeth Jacobsen













In 2012 the Simi Valley Chamber of Commerce formed the Workforce Education Coalition (WEC) to develop programs to expose high school students to career opportunities. The WEC is staffed by Marybeth Jacobsen who practiced law in Illinois and California for twenty years before receiving her secondary education teaching certificate. The WEC creates partnerships between businesses and local schools to help build a skilled regional workforce.

Students are exposed to careers by tours in Environmental Science, Healthcare and Manufacturing. Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) skills are encouraged for young women and men. Students are also prepared for careers at monthly dinners meetings. They are taught crucial interviewing and networking skills such as proper dress codes, developing greeting and handshakes and initiating and maintaining good business conversations.

The WEC has inspired careers and open minds of others for careers opportunities in a unique partnership of the city businesses and schools. Students have a better understand of their future and renewed relevance in their studies.




