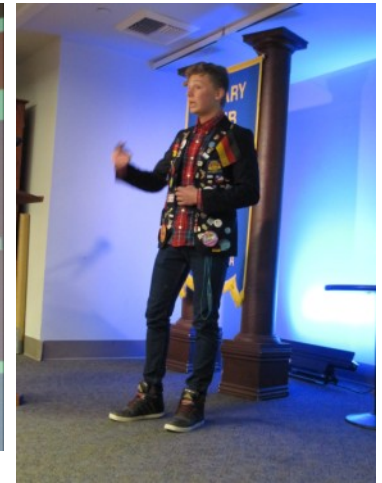

The German Education System By Max Jetter



Our foreign exchange student Max Jetter came with our out going foreign exchange student Talia Garcia. Both are from Royal High School and part of Interact. Max comes from Leonberg, Germany. He is fluent in English, French and German. He is also an elite hockey athlete from nearby Stuttgart. Max gave an excellent synopsis of the German Education System as well as a few facts about Germany.

Germany is in the center of Europe and ties together Western and Eastern Germany. The German flag with an eagle is used for military and government designations. Germany has sixteen states with one outlier, Munich. Munich and Germany is like Texas and the US says Max.



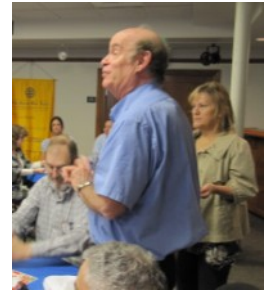
All children in Germany start off at Grundschule which goes from first to fourth grade. From fifth grade, the children are academically sorted into Hauptschule, Realschule or Gymnasium. Hauptschule goes from fifth to ninth grade and students are expected to get a job when they finish. Students in Realschule go to tenth grade after which they can work or go to Berufsschule, similar to a junior college. The highest academic students go to Gymnasium which goes to the twelve grade. Max showed us his school schedule which starts at 8:20am and goes to 5:45pm and has 11 periods! After Gymnasium and Berufsschule students take Abitur, a final and certification exam.

Max described some of his unique American experiences unfamiliar to a student from Germany. School pep rallies, friendly greetings at In and Out Burger and helicopter parents were all new to Max as well as the diverse cultural experiences.
