History

October 3, 1948

 a 29 bed maternity hospital was opened by the Religious Hospitallers of St. Joseph

Hotel Dieu Hospital, September 10, 1953

- 125 bed hospital
- 6 days after official opening, the 24 mothers and 27 babies were transferred across the street to the new building



History

Shaver Hospital, 1930

- Opened an 80 bed sanatorium for patients with tuberculosis
- Became a public hospital in 1972 providing complex continuing care
- In 1983, a 22 inpatient rehabilitation unit was added

Niagara Rehab, 1970

- 26,000 square foot outpatient rehabilitation facility
- In 1990, an additional 27,000 square feet was added



Current Clinical Programs - Inpatient

REHABILITATION – HIGH & LOW INTENSITY

Time-limited, high intensity, interprofessional rehab plan of care, provided to patients that have various musculoskeletal or neurological conditions.

COMPLEX CARE REHAB LOW

Patients are admitted from an acute care hospital after an acute event with the goal of improving functional ability to facilitate a safe return to the community.

SHORT TERM MEDICALLY COMPLEX

Patients transferring from acute care with complex medical conditions. The Short Term Medically Complex helps patients and their families identify strategies that support a successful discharge back into the community.

END OF LIFE (5-8)

Provides pain and symptom management combined with emotional and spiritual support to patients at end of life.

Capital Development

In February 2019, Minister of Health Christine Elliott visited HDS to announce a forthcoming \$500,000 planning grant to facilitate development of a submission to the Ministry for construction of building(s) to accommodate an additional 62 rehabilitation beds at HDS.





Since receipt, the grant has been used to retain a number of consultants who specialize in different components of the new build proposal. HDS staff have worked closely with the Project Lead and with the Capital Branch at the Ministry of Health to help ensure that the Stage 1A and 1B has been completed, reviewed and submitted in summer 2020. We are expecting to hear about approval in the fall of 2020.



Capital Investment

In late fall of 2019, MPP Sam Oosteroff visited HDS to announce a \$1.15 million investment of capital infrastructure funds to HDS. These funds have been used for some much needed improvements to the facility such as a new security system, wheelchair accessible ramp and other maintenance.
