<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. To elevate Mang Nik's living conditions by renovating the room where he is locked up more than 20 hours a day</li> <li>2. To encourage independence and socialization by providing a caregiver to assist with Mang Nik's introduction to school and to look after him while his parents are at work.</li> <li>3. To educate and support Mang Nik's parents on the complexities of raising an autistic child in a society where mental illness is stigmatized - causing men, women, and children to be locked away</li> <li>4. To fund Mang Nik's education</li> </ol>	
<b>Plan to do/Completed Task</b>	
<p><u>Tasks completed:</u></p> <p>Mang Nik has been seen by a psychologist to assess his condition. The Solemen Outreach team visits him and his parents often to give support and monitor his condition while we raise funds for the items listed. We have been taking Mang Nik to the beach and swimming. We take him for meals out and he attended his first Solemen Fun Day.</p> <p>Up until this point, Mang Nik has had virtually no social interaction. As a result, he has been hard to handle by his parents and has never been able to attend school. Over the past five months, Mang Nik has experienced love, care, and a small amount of attention we are able to give him on our weekly visits. These actions have already shown up in his behaviour. He exhibits the ability to calm down, listen, and take instruction.</p> <p>Mang Nik has been taken to the local special-needs school he will be able to attend once our funding goal is achieved. There is no doubt that continued social interaction will improve Mang Nik's future outlook.</p> <p><u>Plans:</u></p> <p>Renovate Mang Nik's living area to be safe, habitable, and secure</p> <p>Provide assistance to enroll Mang Nik in a special-needs school close to his home and cover additional costs</p> <p>Hire a care-giver to assist Mang Nik's parents</p>

**About Solemen**

Yayasan Solemen Indonesia supports 2,000 men, women, and children throughout the province of Bali. We call them Solebuddies.

Our Solebuddies are subject to a multitude of disadvantages including, but not limited to, mental and physical disabilities, medical issues, hunger, and poverty. Solemen provides education and employment assistance, medical care, transportation to and from appointments on and off the island, wheelchairs, psychological evaluations and ongoing care for Solebuddies affected by mental disabilities, assistance for major medical procedures, food packages, and more. Assistance is tailored to every case referred to us.

**Are there ways in which other people in the area will benefit indirectly from the project?**

Mental illness and mental disabilities in Indonesian society carry a stigma, resulting in a lack of education in how to handle the people who suffer from them. Families and communities lock men, women, and children away, not out of cruelty or lack of caring, but out of the necessity to contain something they don't understand.

We hope that neighbours, friends, and family members will join in the education process and see Mang Nik (and many others like him) as a valuable asset to the communities they reside in.

Eventually, as with many of our Solebuddies, Mang Nik and his family will gain a sense of independence on how to move forward with his disability. Mang Nik is a very clever and intelligent boy capable of independent thought and expression. Once the family is set up, we will continue to monitor Mang Nik's progress.

**What is the estimated length of time to complete the project?**

Total project time – 4-8 weeks and ongoing care

Time estimates:

Room Renovations – 2-3 weeks

Medication and psychological monitoring – Ongoing  
 Plan for entrance into school – 8-10 weeks

Stage 1

- Renovation of room (including addition of toilet)
- Hiring of caregiver

Stage 2

- Fund Mang Nik's Ongoing Education to ensure he has consistent supervision and socialization so that he is not locked away in his room.
- Retaining caregiver

Total Estimated Cost: IDR 30 million (**AUD 3,000**)
