Ross Cunningham, Liam Edmonson and Kelsey Skeers (Year 11 2018) are going to Canberra for the National Youth Science Forum in Jan 2019. They applied on line, and were interviewed in Adelaide, before their acceptance. They are all looking forward to discovering new information and opportunities for a life in science. Liam is considering architecture, Kelsey pharmacy/ medicine and Foss physiotherapy, but they are all open to change.

In lieu of our programmed guest speaker, who failed to show, Katherine Vincent gave an impromptu presentation on Operation Flinders. OF is a world class outback adventure therapy program which aims to builds self- belief and confidence in young people. 10 girls from Clare High will take part in 2019. Dr Richard Harris (Thai cave rescue) is currently training to become a team leader. The basic format is that there are 6 exercises per year. 10 teams of 10 (from SA) will have 4 leaders in each team. Young people from 13 to 17 years are eligible, for 10 to 14 days camps in the far north Flinders Ranges. They have to become pretty well self- sufficient, with no toilets or showers, no communication with the outside world. They have to cook their own meals, and get along with others. They walk for 8 days with a back pack, and camp out every night. They are encouraged to think about the challenges offered, and they quickly learn manners and respect. The environment truly changes lives for the better. Katherine also expressed her appreciation of Rotary's sponsorship.
