- 2. 35 Christmas hampers have been ordered. Need someone to collect from Adelaide.
- 3. Peter Lisman's resignation has been accepted by the Board.
- 4. St Joseph's School is looking for some financial assistance with training for blind sports. They currently have a blind student.
- 5. Graham Goode reported that the Art Show committee is revamping the sponsorship book, in an attempt to attract some new sponsors.

CLUB ASSEMBLY

- 1.All agreed that the last line of the invocation be changed to the secular "....we give thanks"
- 2. Child Protection Policy new document. The first part has been accepted by the District. It needs to be signed by the YPO and President and displayed at the Rotary Centre. Please see Ian if the "Working with Vulnerable Persons" check applies to you. Moved H Perry Sec G Waldhuter that policy be accepted. Carried.
- 3. STANDING ORDERS (PROCEDURES) In 2011 a team of members drew up revised Standing Orders. Recently a new team has revised them and come up with a draft copy of new suggestions. This will be sent to all members for their considered response. Standing Procedures will be attached to the Constitution and By Laws (both need updating) J Scott suggested that they be sent out to members every year.
- 4. ATTENDANCE AND CATERING: S Freeman advised of several financial shortfalls in income. We need to have more coming in to cover our running costs. Suggestions are: a) ask non-eaters to pay \$2 b) increase price of house drinks. C) increase subs d) small percentage admin fee to be taken from the Project Account for running the club. E) increase price of meal H Perry informed that caterers cannot do a 2-course meal for the current price of \$18. She suggested price go up to \$25, or reduce to one course for \$20. Moved H Perry sec S Freeman Carried Also that house wines be put up to \$5 per glass, \$25 for bottles, \$4 for beer and soft drinks. Moved H Perry Sec M Kimber Carried.

5.Rotary International Constitution and Bye Laws. Rotarian Gavin Dallow has offered to assist any club that wants to upgrade their documents. Our current constitution is in dire need of updating according to lan Howlett. He suggested that some members who may have an interest in this matter, that they join a group to work with Gavin (if we decide to use his services) H Perry said that all members need time to examine our existing constitution.

- 6. Chair Jacka asked for any personal comments about the Club
 - a) M Kimber warned against taking on too much with regard to our membership numbers and average age.
 - b) J Scott said that Club has been remiss in attracting new members, We really need younger ones. For example, the CWA closed down, but was restarted by a new young committee. He also reminded that the downpipe to the rainwater tank needs to be immediately reconnected.
 - c) H Weber suggested that members be informed that they are all welcome to sit in on Board Meetings. Board Minutes be sent to all members with the understanding that they a classified as not accepted until the next Board Meeting.
 - d) We should have more self-catered BBQ meals to cut costs.

CLUB ASSEMBLY closed at this point.

- 3) A list of duties for Set-Up will be circulated. Copies will be laminated and displayed
- 4) Looking for ideas for Christmas Pageant float. She suggested to highlight sanitary awareness that Rotary is promoting in third world countries; hand washing, teeth cleaning etc. Soap bubbles could be blown from the float into the crowd other ideas please.
- 5) It was suggested that everyone be responsible for their own badges, and the practice of carrying them around in the cabinets is getting a bit old.
- 6) The door entry code should be changed at intervals?
- 7) 2020/21 positions need to be thought about.
- 8) AGM is first Monday in December
