#### President's reminders:

#### **Guest Speaker:** Sue Russell—Cochlea Implants

- Described the difference between an implant and a hearing aid
- Hearing aids amplify
- Implant contains electrodes which send impulses to signal brain to relay frequency not heard
- Available to those needing from 9months to 83years
- Sue born with normal hearing but had fever at 7months and lost her hearing
- Learnt to lip read and also sign language.
- At age of 35 given grant. Approached Apex and Rotary
- Lost ability to listen to radio, running water, bird song, grass and leaves rustling. Unable to hear adequately on phone.
- Applied at Flinders Medical Centre. Waited
  6 years because using other strategies well
- Ran support group in Freeling and had people from wide spread area attend monthly meetings
- Now living in retirement village
- Recovery time was 3 days in hospital plus another 6 weeks. Now day surgery and about a week or 2.
- Works differently for people
- Brain may have difficulty interpreting sounds made and may have problems in noisy situations or when people behind
- Before implant did not hear own name.
- Music enhanced
- Cost PHS limited numbers now 18 per annum, waiting list 3 years. \$32000 for implant alone. Testing, mapping, tuning etc additional cost.
