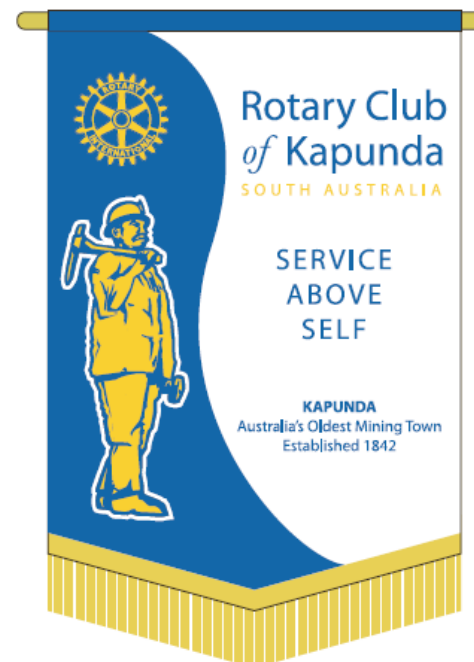

Meeting 2746 held on the 11th of November 2019

Joint Club officials meeting prior to main meeting - attended by David and Frank

- Meeting addressed by Jane Owens District Governor - the main points (some discussion also ensued.)
- Rotary has trouble keeping members particularly women
- The district is asking for between 5 and 10% of our fundraising to go towards the Rotary Foundation (we have Frank working on an invitation for Doug Layng, District Foundation Leader to come and talk to us about the Foundation)
- Clubs can apply for district grants; we need to think of a project. Suggested that clubs could use Facebook, asking the broader community any ideas for a project, assuming we can't think of any ourselves
- Asking clubs to use 'Myrotary' to upload things eg goals for the club
- A media campaign to promote Rotary is commencing on the 1st of December 2019
- Clubs need to ensure that branding is updated on all publications, be they online or otherwise, encouraging Rotarians to attend the Rotary Leadership Institute seminars to learn about Rotary
- Want an emphasis on inducting new members properly
- Child protection procedures have changed we will be updating those as ours expire.

Notes from main group nine meeting

(Attended by David, Frank, Brenton and Raelene, and Don and Sondra.)

President David opened meeting 2746

- The meeting was attended by about 80 Rotarians and guests from all 6 clubs in our current group. The meeting was hosted by the Rotary Club of Barossa District and held at the Vine Inn.

Guest Speaker, Jane Owens District Governor

Told the group a bit about her life; she is Scottish by birth and in 1991 immigrated to Whyalla. Initially she didn't want to stay but she went into community nursing and domiciliary care

working with the elderly which was a new career for her. She then subsequently studied management. When her boys left home, she looked for an avenue to volunteer and joined Rotary. She subsequently became President of the Rotary Club of Whyalla then worked on the Rotary Leadership Institute, then became Assistant Governor and then District Governor. She alluded to the current theme ‘Rotary Connects the World’ and made the point that all Rotarians are connected by the fact they are Rotarians. She reminded us that the Rotary Foundation is our charity and invited all clubs to commit between 5% and 10% of their fundraising towards that cause. She also reminded us that we will be District 9510 from the 1st of July 2020; a much larger district. She said that the DG nominee position is open now and said that the DG Rotary journey is rewarding if anyone is interested.

Gavin Sidhu, Rotary Club of Barossa Valley, Ugandan Dental Project update.

All clubs in Group 9 have donated and Rotary is currently signing Memorandums of Understanding with the major dental hospital in Uganda to supply the program for 25000 children. They are also investigating ways of keeping the program sustainable once the Rotary money is exhausted.

Our Meeting 2746 was then closed by our president David and other Presidents did likewise.
