Recipes

Nutella Apple Rolls(Jenny Schutz)

<u>Ingredients</u>: Nutella puff pastry sheets tin of pie apples/cooked

apple slices

<u>Method:</u> Cut puff pastry into 4 squares.

Spread Nutella diagonally from corner to corner of pastry.

Place apples on top of Nutella.

Roll up pastry from pointed corner and seal.

Brush with milk and sprinkle with cinnamon and sugar.

Bake in a moderate oven on a Glad Bake covered tray till lightly browned.

Crusty Seasoned Chicken(Jenny Schutz)

3 – 4 chicken thighs 1 ½ cups bread(diced)

1 small onion(chopped) 1 cup milk(1/2 milk & ½ water)

1 oz butter 1 pkt chicken noodle soup 1tspn parsley

Cut up chicken and roll in seasoned flour(plain flour, Gravox, salt & pepper).

Place into a greased casserole dish.

Mix bread, onion, parsley & butter in a small bowl before sprinkling over chicken.

Add soup mix to the milk and pour over the chicken.

Cover and bake in a moderate oven for about 35 – 40 mins till cooked.

*You can use ½ BBQ chicken and cook for less time

Hamburger Patties(Gwen Higgins)

500g mince

Chopped onion

1cup water

1 cup milk

1pkt chicken noodle soup

Mix all ingredients together & let stand for 2 hours then stir in 1 cup SR flour

Mixture is quite wet

Place large spoonsful in a hot pan with a little oil

Can be frozen after cooking


Simple slice(Pam Howard)

Melt together 4oz butter & 3/4 cup sugar(I use brown sugar) in a saucepan. Allow to cool slightly. Add a beaten egg &1/2 tsp vanilla. Stir in 1 cup SR flour & 1 cup of sultanas.

Place in a slice tray (approx. 9inch square) Can sprinkle with slivered almonds or leave as is .

Bake in a moderate oven 20—30 mins
