Sites: Sea World, Lone Pine Koala Sanctuary, Qld Academy of Sport, Biology Centre, Australian Space Agency. Sciences such as optometry, anthropology, agriculture, DNA experienced. A very social event – groups were together 12 to 15 hrs per day. Got to know each other. Personal development was stressed as important. The experience clarified future pathways in science – participants got a vision of what is possible as a career, and gained more confidence. Contrary to popular belief of a few years ago, a majority of science students are girls. All the speakers showed their enthusiasm and gratitude for the experience, and thanked our Club sincerely, offering their assistance to the next batch of recipients.
