<u>Guest Speakers:</u> Julie Tucker and Karen Redman on Male Incontinence

Julie Tucker:

- Significant statistics—4.8 million people experience incontinence
- Denial and lack of awareness
- Can be any age group or gender
- 1in4 have this problem
- Faecal incontinence 1% of men
- Causes social isolation
- Highest occurrence in middle aged people
- Wide variety of issues including impact on community
- Pack passed around
- Facilities and public toilets rarely provide for men with incontinence provisions eg sanitary disposal bins

Karen Redman:

- Julie asked what council is doing to provide suitable facilities
- Men's health not as well funded
- Julie well known for leadership in this field
- Motion put to council and further information sought and considered
- Motion passed to provide sanitary bins in council toilets
- Other councils asking for information
- Gawler not on National Toilet map but this will happen

- Finding underlying cause really important as treatment depends on cause
