Public garden preserves a tradition of living beauty

The Jensen-Olson Arboretum at Mile 25 is unique in its setting, history, and preservation. The 14-acre public garden dates back 120 years as the homestead of miners John and Marie (Jensen) Peterson, who brought plants from their native Germany. By 1904, Marie was growing produce for Juneau grocers. Eventually, the property was inherited by a nephew, Carl Jensen, and his wife, Caroline, an avid gardener. In 1998, she worked with the SE Alaska Land Trust to create a conservation easement to protect the property. Upon her death in 2006, the property was transferred to the city; it opened to the public in 2007.



JOA's single full-time employee, Merrill Jensen (no relation) lives on the site. JOA, which is free, is a JGR service project. The club constructed the fence (below, left) and two years ago built a gazebo (left) that looks out on Pearl Harbor (below, right). JGR currently is working with CBJ to develop a parking area and trail there.
