Foundation fundamentals

November 9th will be upon us soon, where we gather as Rotarians and friends to contribute to our Rotary Foundation and local youth. Our contribution of time, funds, creativity and service all come together in our annual auction event. Outcry items donated by JG Rotarians will raise monies for Foundation, where it will benefit future club, district, and international endeavors. Silent auction's profits continue to contribute to local youth programs here in Juneau.

Established in 1957, a Paul Harris Fellow, named after Rotary's founder, is awarded to offer appreciation for and encourage contributions to Rotary Foundation. Fellows initially receive a certificate, medallion, and pin for their first \$1,000 in contributions. As Fellows contribute additional funds in \$1,000 increments (up to \$9,000) they receive pins bejeweled with sapphires or rubies, commensurate with their donation level. The Paul Harris Society, Arch Klumph Society, and Bequest Society are other recognitions earned for donations given above and beyond those of Paul Harris Fellow.

Foundation Recognition Points (FRP's) are also awarded for every dollar given to Rotary Foundation's Annual Fund or Polio Plus Fund. These points accumulate in a member's Rotary International Foundation account and can be transferred to other Rotary members, friends, family, and any individual toward a Paul Harris Fellow recognition. In past, when an abundance of FRP's have accumulated, JG Rotarians have generously given these to fellow club members for donations made to our auction event to help them along to their first or perhaps next level of PH Fellow. We hope to award FRP's again this year.

Food and animal enterprises in Cameroon, Ecuador, and the Philippines were chosen to receive KIVA loans, bringing to \$67,575 the total lent by the club through the micro-lending organization since 2008. Eric Carver, Robert Minch, Julie Olson, and Candy Behrends stayed after last week's regular JGR meeting to divvy up \$925 available from change collected at meetings and pay backs from prior recipients. Loans, (typically about \$100) went to purchase farm animals, a dried fish operation, a small restaurant, a tamale maker, and a spice producer. The club has made 642 loans in 65 of 80 countries served by KIVA.



Rotary Radio Day and Fun Run exceed \$36,000

An all-day radio appeal and 5K/1 Mile Fun Run last Saturday raised \$36,975 for Polio Plus. That amount includes a 2:1 match from the Gates Foundation. Oct. 24, was World Polio Day, per Rotary's #1 goal.
