

Balancing act: resource development vs. resource protection

Alaska is a young state that needs infrastructure, such as harbors, airports, power generation, and roads. And, it's dependent on monetizing its raw resources, including oil, gas, minerals, and timber. So, how are those needs addressed without ruining habitat critical to another valuable resource: fish? That's the question that biologist and JGR member Jackie Timothy has had to balance for two decades.

Timothy is about to retire after a decade as the Southeast Regional Supervisor of the Division of Habitat within the Alaska Department of Fish & Game. She came to Juneau to complete graduate work in 1994, a single mom of four children who had just earned her BS in Biology with a minor in chemistry from the University of

Utah. In 1999, she adopted her youngest son, David, who experiences Down syndrome; and Jackie has long been active in supporting those with disabilities.

Today, the Habitat Division is assessing how protection processes will change if the salmon initiative passes in November. Jackie retires in December.

Run so that others may walk

In conjunction with the radio fundraiser for polio on Saturday, October 20, local Rotary clubs are sponsoring the fourth annual 5K run and 1-mile walk that morning at 10 am, beginning at Riverbend Elementary School. Participants can register on-site. It's \$20 for adults and \$10 for students. All proceeds go to Rotary's 30-year worldwide priority to eradicate polio. In the past 30 years, Rotary and its partners have immunized 2.5 billion children in 122 countries, reducing polio incidents by 99.9 percent.

Club lends \$1,800; total pushing \$78,000

Club members made 18 loans in 13 countries last Saturday through the KIVA micro-lending program. This is the tenth year the club has collected loose change and reinvested loan paybacks.

To date, JGR has made 769 loans with a total value of \$77,550. Loans have been made in all of the 75 countries that KIVA serves. Just over 42 percent of those loans have been in agriculture sectors.

Kenya, Philippines, and Ecuador each have received about 10 percent of club investments. JGR's goal is to loan \$100,000 by 2020.

Bulb drive nets nearly \$14,000

Members sold more than \$16,000 worth of bulbs, nearly \$1,000 in Power Planter fees, and attracted more than \$4,000 in donations during its annual fundraiser.

According to President-Elect Julie Olson, was managed the three-month campaign, JGR will net just under \$14,000. (The goal was to raise \$11,000.) The sale ended last weekend with the distribution and on-site sale of bulbs (above) at the AELP warehouse.

A half-dozen members sold more than \$800 each: Candy Behrends, Stephanie Hoag, Paul Dick, Kim Kiefer, Julie Olson, and Amy Lujan.



Twenty-two members met the \$400 per person goal; 53 of 58 members sold bulbs.

Alaska Marine Lines donated shipping; Super Bear donated paper bags, and AELP contributed space for sorting and distribution.
