JGR places second in race; brings home donation towards re-building playground

At the District 5010 conference last weekend, JGR took second place in the March competition to be the first to raise \$1,049 to donate to ShelterBox, an official Rotary International partner. The amount matches the miles in the annual Iditarod sled dog race, which commemorates the 1925 delivery of diphtheria serum to Nome. In addition, JGR was presented with a \$100 check to help rebuild Twin Lakes play structures, which burned April 24.
