The New JACC – only major shovel-ready project – brings jobs

The partnership working to build the new Juneau Arts and Culture Center is gearing up for a major financial push to get construction underway on the \$20 million facility. (Total price tag is \$26 million, which includes coordination, consulting studies, design, and engineering.) The campaign is more than one-third toward a project-launch goal of \$11.4 million. Groundbreaking is targeted for next year. Motivating factors include (for more info, see www.newjacc.org):

- Juneau is top-rated among arts indices (which evaluate arts involvement in a community and its economy), but may be the only capital city without a performing arts center. (The Arts and Humanities Council has spent nearly a decade in the 60-year-old armory, which is booked 350 days a year.)
- The city's 2008 Comprehensive Plan calls for a downtown performing arts complex. The CBJ has provided a land lease and \$1 million in startup funds.
- The 36,000 square foot facility is designed and is the only shovel-ready big project on the horizon for the community. The New JACC will generate 30 jobs during construction and ten new permanent jobs once it opens. (The Juneau Community Foundation is administering a \$1 million endowment to be supplemented during fundraising -- to fund operations.) A recent McDowell study determined the New JACC would break even in three years.
