JGR's youth strategy to be honed for action

Deciding how to most effectively support youth in our community will be the focus of this week's meeting.

The strategic planning will be led by one of the club's charter members, Kevin Ritchie. The former city manager of Juneau, Ritchie headed the Municipal League for 13 years.



Since his retirement, however, his focus has been squarely on improving the lives of local youth. The list of his kid-related commitments is impressive: Friends of the Zach Gordon Youth Center, the Juneau After-School Coalition (which founded), the Alaska Afterschool Network, Juneau Big Brothers/Big Sisters Local Council, ROCK Juneau (Raising Our Children with Kindness), Juneau Suicide Prevention Coalition, Juneau Children's PAC, and Juneau Best Starts. Best Starts has worked three years to enhance the quality and availability of childcare in the Capital City. (The Assembly did not permit a public vote on funding a training and pay-incentive program. Newly-elected Mayor Beth Weldon has appointed a task force on the topic.)

Rotary's options for youth support include raising and donating money (as occurs with the silent auction portion of the Foundation fundraiser in November); planning and implementing youth activities; taking a leadership role on non-partisan community issues; and/or partnering with other clubs and organizations.

Previously, the club has identified prime needs of local youth, such as basic needs, healthy families, having mentors, participating in physical activity, getting a good education that provides job readiness, and exposure to civics and arts.

And, JGR has identified desirable outcomes for youth: success in school and work, to be goal driven and self-reliant, to have meaningful, positive relationships, to be good parents, to be free from substance abuse, and to be community engaged.
