- 1. Any member Rotary Club of District 9465 can apply.
- 2. Limit of one application per club.
- 3. Applications close on 29 January 2018.
- 4. To streamline the application process, we'll accept applications online here.
- 5. Maximum grant to an individual club will be \$2000. Unless otherwise agreed, applicant clubs will be expected to make a matching contribution to project costs.
- 6. Multi-club project proposals will be favourably considered. A Rotaract club can apply in partnership with one or more Rotary clubs.
- 7. Examples of projects appropriate for grant support include, but are not limited to:
 - a. Formation of new clubs (including satellites)
 - b. Conduct of major Yass-style recruitment campaigns.
 - c. Conduct of major initial business networking events (as per the Stockbridge model).
 - d. Formation, training and development of membership experience teams.
 - e. Club restructuring, including amalgamations.
 - f. The development and implementation of innovative new arrangements to improve the member experience.
- 8. Applicant clubs will be asked to submit their 2018 membership plan with their final MOU.
- 9. Grant funds will not normally be used to fund operating or recurrent costs of clubs.
- 10. Governance and reporting to be based on the District Foundation Committee protocols for the governance and reporting of District Grants.
- 11. Briefing for all clubs to be held via Zoom (details TBA). A recording will be available for those unable to attend the live briefing. Want to attend the Zoom briefing? Register here.
- 12. Grant applications will be received via a dedicated online application form.
- 13. Successful applicant clubs will sign an MOU with the district re the grant prior to transfer of grant funds.
