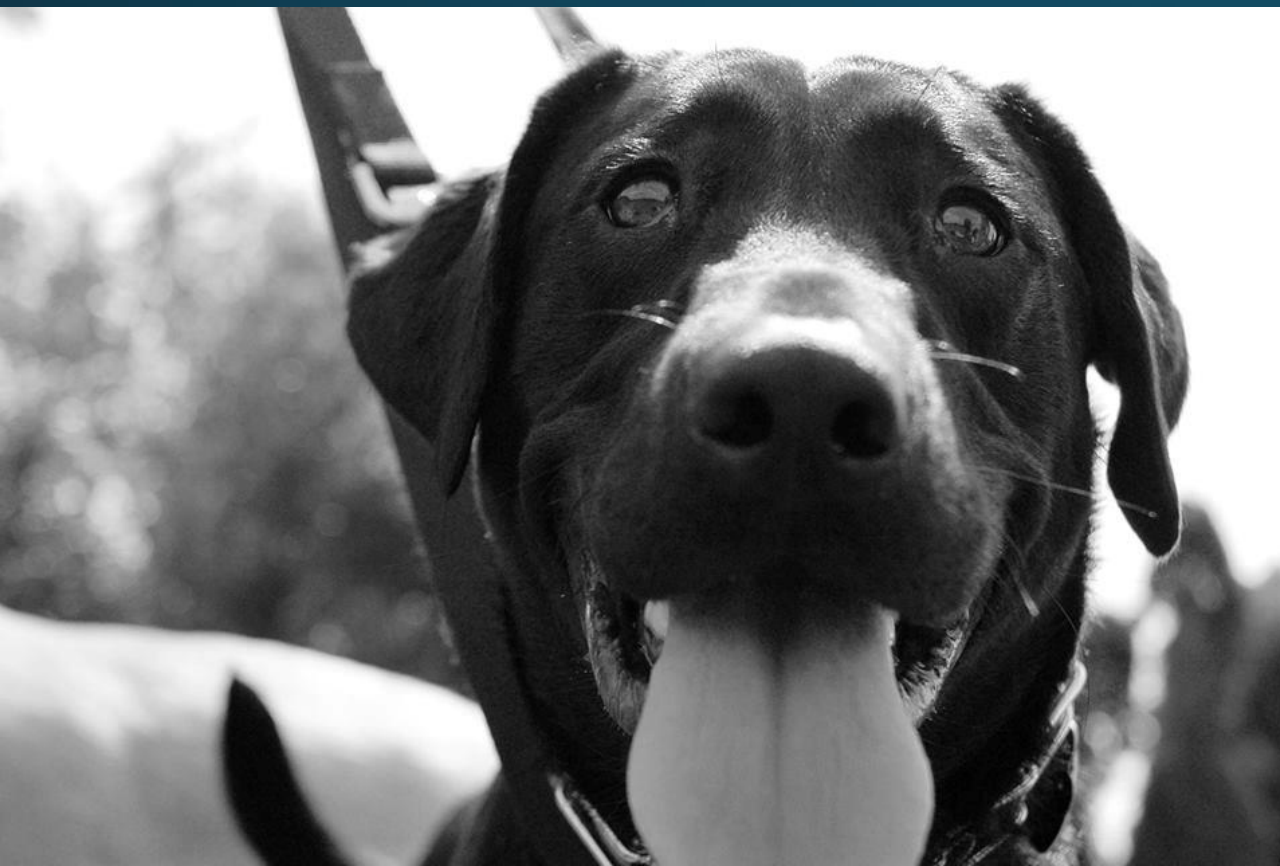


My family...

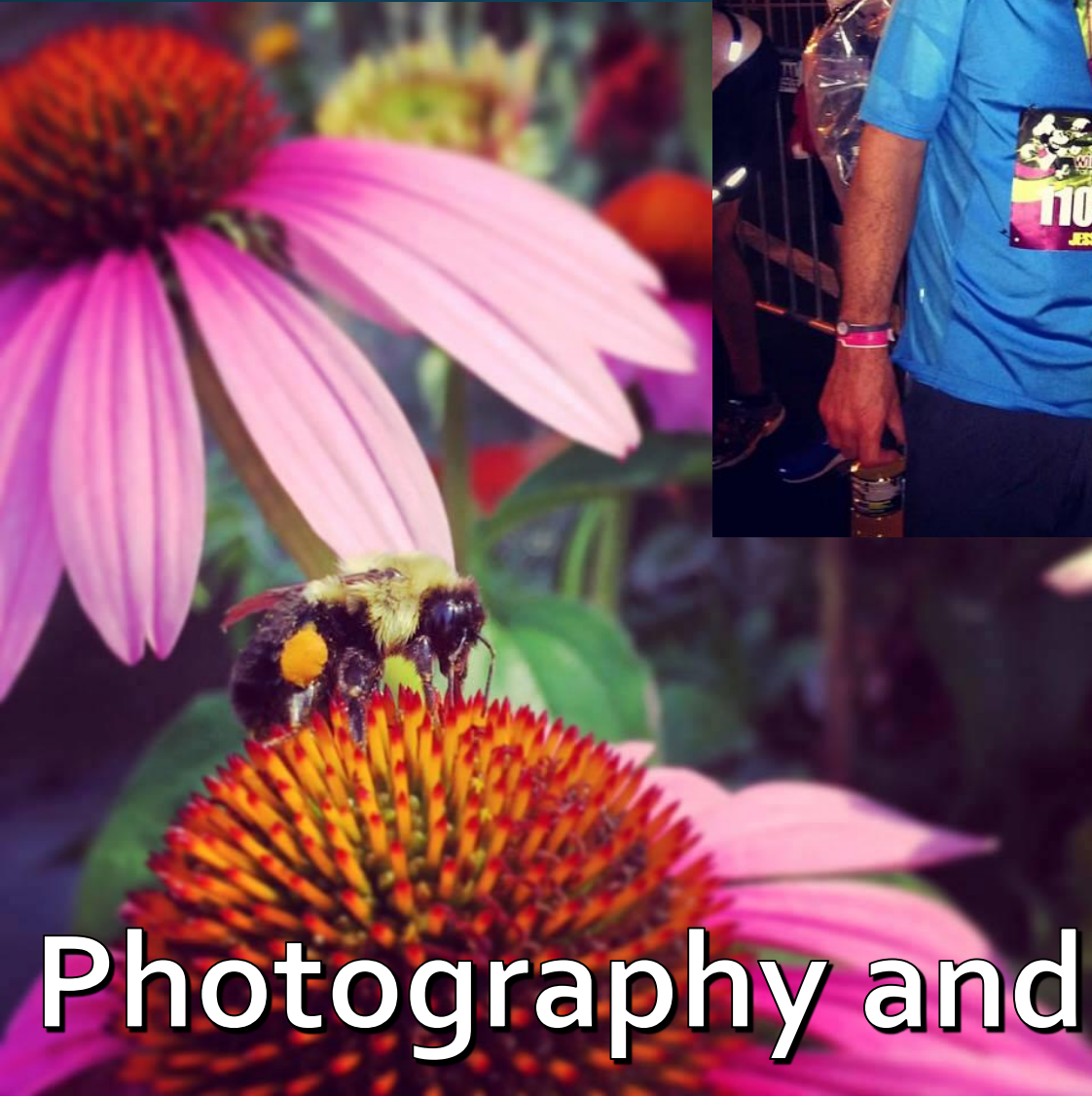
