Success By 6 brings together early childhood educators and directors, public school administrators and teachers, businesses, health centers, advocates and parents to support early childhood education. A variety of publications, professional development activities, preschool scholarship funding and community outreach programs assist early childhood educators and families throughout the year.

SERVICES INCLUDE

- Promote the importance of early childhood education on children's readiness for kindergarten
- Other community outreach programs: Week of the Young Child and Transition to Kindergarten spaces in public libraries
- Professional development and incentive awards for early childhood educators and an annual early learning conference for preschool and public school educators
- Parenting and preschool publications for families with young children

IN 2021-2022 SUCCESS BY 6

- Provided 14 preschool scholarships.
- Distributed 6,413 Getting Ready for Kindergarten calendars.
- Provided 1,114 books to children as part of our Reach Out and Read program.
- Provided 1,316 books to 188 children as part of our Real Men Read program.
