SPEAKERS REVIEW by Patty Roos

Bob Frame introduced us to Frank Peter with Cogent Building Diagnostics

Topic was on Defective Leaking Stucco

They are not contractors but make sure it is fixed. They help people to solve the problem. Stucco has been in use for a long time and is in demand. What needs to be considered when using it is that masonry cracks happen. Windows failing which allow for water to get behind the stucco is the major reason behind the problems with stucco. Stucco likes to store water. Only 2-3% of the houses needing repair need to have all the stucco removed, otherwise just the section where the water has come in needs to be replaced. All houses need to be continually maintained so check on your home spring and fall, looking for cracks and water spots. Evaluations range from \$900-1200. Unfortunately it is rare that this type of repair can fall under homeowner's insurance
