Dr. Paul Morgan, professor at West Chester University, spoke to us about Sustainability. He spoke to us back in 2014 as well. Sustainability brings together harmony of the economy, the environment and people. The Eagles Stadium is the leader in sustainability in the NFL.

Sustainability is a MegaTrend. There are so many more people on the planet and that is creating great demands on the environment. We all want to live long happy healthy lives and the next generations want to as well. In order to do so, we must address the issue of sustainability.

Dr. Morgan spoke about Climate Change. He says the evidence is overwhelming and the trend is higher and higher temperatures. Super storms have had a big impact on the world which he believes are a result of climate change. The Paris Climate Agreement was rejected by our current administration, but we are still in and he says there is plenty of US support to stay in it.

Society is entranced by what we expect our "future" to be and it dominates our imagination and what the media hypes. But people don't really want to live in a Jetson's world where there are no trees and food comes from a dispenser. We need to change the track. We need a new vision. We learn what we live. Our education for sustainability is very important. WCU is a leader in sustainability. All students are taught about it before they graduate.

There was time for questions:

Q: How do you know if the students get it? A: They change what they do.

Q: Are there other colleges adopting the sustainability challenge? A: All of them must.

Q: How important is buy-in from the population? A: Without it, progress drags.

Q: Does the Federal or State Government provide grants for projects supporting sustainability? A: Yes, there are some. He would like to see more.

Rotary turned to PHS because the 190-year-old nonprofit organization coordinates volunteer tree plantings of nearly 2,000 trees in the 5-county Southeastern PA region every year.
