Lynmar Brock introduced his guest, his lovely wife, Claudie. Jim Gasho wished birthday greetings to Dave Biffen, who shared some unsmokable cigars with him, and Brad Abel extended birthday greetings to Jack Wintermute, after quoting Mark Twain about aging.

Bunny Welsh kicked off Happy Bucks by donating a dollar for each knee that she had replaced last year, giving her pain free movement now. Katie Martin was happy it wasn't her birthday after hearing the previous birthday greetings. Rick Stevenson was happy to invite us to the Sunrise Club's Second Annual Trivia Night. He noted that 8 of the 12 available tables have already been sold.

President Bill, looking back at Rotary history, noted that Paul Woodruff was inducted in 1964, and Rich Murray and Andy Keen were inducted in 2015. **President Bill** announced that our club will be helping with the Multiple Sclerosis walk on May 5<sup>th</sup>, so please consider volunteering that day. He also read a note from Jim Christ, who spoke recently about the Paoli Battlefield, saying he appreciated the opportunity to speak to our club. **President Bill** also noted that the District Sasy Awards, Rotary's version of the Grammy's, will be held March 15<sup>th</sup> at the Springfield Country Club, with the District Conference to follow the next day. ## **SPEAKERS REVIEW by Faith Woodward**

**Bob Frame** introduced Tom Hannum, Harley Davidson dealer with dealerships in Media, Chadds Frod, Sellersville, Scranton, and Rahway, NJ. His Marketing Director Carrie Kennedy hardly got a chance to speak since Tom is so enamored with his Harleys.

Tom's family has been in West Chester for years. His grandfather and father were both graduates of WC East HS and his wife and sister graduated from Henderson HS. Before he became a Marine, Tom's father raced Harleys. Tom's father bought the

dealership that became Hannum Harley Davidson in 1954. The business was originally in Crum Lynne but it was burned down by an angry customer. That's when the business moved to Media.

They had a robbery once and 3 bikes were stolen. When his father called the president of the local Harley club, those bikes were located quickly and returned. In the 70s and 80s they sold Kawasakis and Hondas but by the 90s they were selling only Harleys. The Scranton location was purchased most recently. That dealership had been very successful but when it was sold the first time, the new owner changed the name. Purchases dropped off dramatically to only 200 in a year until Tom then purchased the business and returned its name to Electric City. In the first year, they sold 650 bikes! All the dealerships that Tom has purchased were under performing until Tom turned their businesses around.

The Harley Davidson Conference will be in Milwaukee this year. Smaller clubs refer to themselves as HOGs (Harley Owners Group).

The Hannum Harley Davidson group donates a trailer full of toys and money to The Annual Children's Hospital in New Brunswick each year. Last year they donated \$25,000. Charity groups can also use their facilities for events.

Tom's family likes to race bikes just as their father and grandfather did. His son and daughters all race. In fact, he has 10 Hondas in his garage!

Harley purchasers increasingly include females. Last year 40% of the new buyers were women. He has also seen an increase in younger and minority purchasers.

Tom envisions a promising future with 100 models coming out in the next 10 years. He also agreed to sponsor our Chili Cook Off!
