SPEAKERS REVIEW by Pat Henson

The Chester County District Attorney, Tom Hogan, gave a presentation on The Opioid Epidemic, Prescription Drugs & Heroin.

Tom Hogan is the Chester County District Attorney. Elected in 2011, Mr. Hogan is the chief law enforcement officer in Chester County. He is responsible for coordinating the investigation and prosecution of all crimes in Chester County and keeping over 500,000 Chester County residents safe. Many facts were presented regarding how the crisis came about, what it is all about, and how to overcome it. In fact, 500,000 people in the US have died of overdoses in the last 15 years. This is more than the amount of casualties the US sustained in WWII. It is the number one cause of death in the US. Pennsylvania ranks 8th nationally in drug related Both illegal/drug dealers and abuse of deaths. prescription drugs are to blame. Some sources say that 70% of the US population is on prescription drugs at any given time citing the overuse of antibiotics, antidepressants and opioids, in that order Historical trends of the upswing in drug use were cited. Availability is widespread and heroin is very inexpensive. A 2016 study showed that in a five county region, overdoses occurred from 900 being the highest in Philadelphia, to 97 being the lowest in Chester County.

Tom also explained several measures being used to fight the problem of drug abuse and overdose. One is the use of Narcan which is the opiate antidote administered in suspected cases of overdoses. Another is the Good Samaritan Law that generally provides basic legal protection for those who assist a person who is injured or in danger. It seems this law would not only protect medical professionals, but perhaps co-users of drugs who are in the company of the person who might be overdosing. A "warmhandoff program" has begun in some local hospitals where people addicted to heroin will be connected with treatment options, often via the encouragement of a recovered addict. There is also a "hard-handoff" program that is being considered which will give families the option of committing another family member who has overdosed to a treatment center.
