SPEAKERS REVIEW by Glen Sweet Quaker Bolivia Link

Dan Wilson introduced Ed Dunlop, Quaker Bolivia Link (QBL) Board Chairman and Renee Melina of Wilmington, also a member of the QBL Board. QBL began 20 years ago and has offices in the United Kingdom, Bolivia and the United States. It is a 503(c) non-sectarian organization that works with indigenous people to reduce poverty. QBL adheres to the Quaker principles of integrity, simplicity, equality, community and peace.

The mission of QBL is to support locally developed, sustainable projects that enable economic development, access to safe, clean water and application of viable agricultural and livestock production practices for food security. Bolivia is one of the poorest countries in South America. Two out of 10 children die before their fifth birthday. A high proportion of children suffer from iron anemia. Only

one out of five houses in the rural areas have access to clean water. OBL's current work is focused on villages of indigenous people in the Alta Plana of Bolivia, high in the Andes Mountains. These people live in extreme isolation and poverty.

Projects are planned by the local people who contribute 20 percent of the project costs with their labor. The local government contributes another 30 percent of the project cost and QBL the final 50 percent. A local board is established that collects small fees to help maintain and manage the project.

Without easy access to clean water, local people spend much of their day carrying water from the source to their village. QBL projects offer clean, fresh water systems that are sourced from a spring or well upstream from the community to be served. It is piped underground to standpipes in the village for access by the residents. These clean water projects now serve approximately 2,000 families.

Quinoa, a good source of iron and other minerals, is a principal crop of the indigenous people. It used to be a main source of nutrition but due to its growing popularity in the developed world, most of it is now exported. Hand threshing of quinoa is a very slow process. QBL assisted with a mechanized threshing machine powered by a gasoline engine which increased production 30 to 40 times.

Another project involves the construction of greenhouses built from rock with translucent plastic on top. Because of consistent freezing temperatures at night, greenhouses are necessary to grow leafy green vegetables to help meet the nutritional needs of the indigenous people.

Diane Lemonides and **Paul Woodruff** asked questions about coordinating with other similar organizations and local Rotary Clubs.
