To start the program, a talented violinist played a musical piece based on a Spanish favorite, The Tarantella.

The symphony is celebrating 77 years as the area's

premier professional orchestra. Kennett Square is the smallest community in the United States with a professional orchestra. They present a wide range of music, educate underserved audiences and provide children's concerts and outreach. They play at Longwood Gardens and at Unionville High School among venues in the county.

The symphony holds six concerts annually including, opening night masterworks, holiday and family concerts, a symphonic chamber concert and symphony under the stars. They hold a young artist competition and sponsor a children's chorus.

The symphony has a full time executive director, other executives and volunteer positions. They are always looking to improve their business model and conduct fundraising throughout the year. 
