Just for the record, top dead center is a position in the four-stroke combustion process wherein the piston is at the topmost point in its stroke. This can either be during the compression phase or the combustion phase.

The "Top Dead Center Motor Club" was originally established at Tom Oates Chevrolet in Chester Springs in January 2009 with 15 members in attendance for their inaugural meeting. They have a really strong lineup of businesses who sponsor the club.

The club is dedicated to the restoration and preservation of classic, antique, modified and custom cars, trucks, and motorcycles.
