SPEAKER REVIEW by Winnie Stroup

Glen Sweet introduced her friend Brett Anderson Walker who she described as a talented painter, sculptor, film maker, and recently turned author.

Brett shared that he first learned to draw when he was 4 as he watched his father draw cartoons. By age 5 he was teaching kids he knew at school to draw... for a fee. By 14, he was painting in oil, heavily influenced by German expressionism and Van Gough's post impressionism. By 18 he moved to pastels, becoming an advocate for pastel paintings. He points out that Old Masters oil paintings in museums have lines and cracks in the paint itself. By contrast Pastels survive well.

Brett lived in Paris for 3 years, Normandy for 1 year and Aix au Provence for another year. Once he moved back to the States, he and his wife Brigitte and son Shane spent most summers in France and still travel often. In the 90's he started writing screen plays. Fourteen years ago, he co-founded the West Chester Film Festival with Laura Barton. It's held the last weekend of April every year.

He was inspired to become an author when he heard a radio program that documented the Russian Mob kidnapping children and putting them into sex trafficking. He noted that the reality is so horrific that it's almost impossible to think about it. He thought that if he could create a novel that was fun to read, people could absorb bits and pieces of the reality. The result is <u>The Killing Name</u>.

Research into 2 Mob brothers, who lived in Nizhny Tagil, Russia, launched Brett's story line. The town that sets the troubling prologue to <u>The Killing Name</u>. In his novel, Brett has the brothers move to Paris. There he introduces Cubby Dillon, an artist who can never finish a painting but who is very good at finding people. Coby will also be the protagonist in Brett's next novel which is almost finished. A Parisian Police Inspector is another finely drawn character who benefits from Brett's intimate knowledge of Paris and a personal experience with Black Market for art. He's also researched the Russian Mob's strategy of taking over local Mobs and infiltrating local governments. For example, the Israeli Mob was taken over by Russians posing as Jews.

Mickey Hall read <u>*The Killing Name*</u> last weekend and highly recommends it.
