SPEAKER REVIEW by Pat Henson

Before giving us his account on the trip to Pakistan, **Dwight Leeper** told us when he first began to truly understand what the Rotary was all about. It was around 2012 when he decided that he and his wife, Wendy, should go to Pakistan on a National Immunization Day (NID) which is a world-wide effort to eradicate polio. This has been a Rotarian endeavor for the past 25 years.

Dwight challenged us to "just say yes" explaining there is so much a person can do or be a part of if he or she can just get past fear. Dwight also shared a quote, though it is paraphrased here: Even if you do not know how to do it, say yes and learn how to do it later.

Dwight noted that there is peace through service and that there are so many ways to serve through the Rotary. We should not be short on ideas. In this case, Dwight contacted the Rotary for suggestions exploring International in opportunities that would be more complex, different from what we typically in our communities here in the He soon had the pleasure of meeting a Rotary International President Tanaka prior to the trip to Pakistan and Jalal Ahmed from Bangladesh who were instrumental in guiding him on to such an extraordinary experience.

While the volunteers were there to represent Rotary in North America and to assist specifically with polio vaccinations, Dwight pointed out the numerous issues that exist within Pakistan making it very difficult to know what to focus on first. Pakistan is one of the fastest growing countries in the world, but they also have one of the highest mortality rates for mothers and babies. It is also one of only three countries left with endemic polio.

Eighty percent of the population is illiterate, which makes it very difficult to communicate what needs to happen to bring about change. The Taliban and other religious leaders bent on keeping power are actively working against polio vaccinations, tell people that it will make their children infertile and infer that it is somehow 'un-Islamic'. Dwight said that one way they are counteracting this is by meeting with men who hold the title of Imam (an Islamic religious leadership position). By building these relationships, the hope is that the people of Pakistan will trust the western way of fighting polio. In regard to illiteracy. the workers communicated using cartoonish type drawings. However awkward, it seems to be working. Sanitation, economy, and transient populations are a few of the other major barriers to working with the Pakistani people. They are hard working and hope very much for economic success. The unrest in the whole region causes people to migrate from Afghanistan and India, down into Pakistan and back again, thus making something like polio even harder to control. Polio can stay alive more than a week outside a host, making it extremely infectious. One of the tactics used to inoculate was operating from toll booths on major highways. Another way was going from door to door. Interestingly, families kept track of who received the vaccine by noting the information on the wall of their homes.

The Taliban and their propaganda, especially at the time of the trip, was an overbearing obstacle. There were shootings and bombings with barricades everywhere. Rumors that Osama Bin Laden's whereabouts had been reported by a polio worker made it very difficult for everyone. Some polio workers had been shot and killed randomly.

Dwight said that he was very proud to have been a part of this effort in Pakistan and that polio is very close to being eradicated. The Pakistani Rotarians and the people who wanted their children to be treated for polio were very accepting of the volunteer's presence; even having a march down the main street one day.

In 2014, Dwight had the opportunity go to Nepal, India on a mission where his son accompanied him.

The final challenge was to "Be Our (Rotary) Story" in an effort to support and strengthen clubs; To Be Seen and to get out into the world; To Tell Our Story; and To Invite People to our causes and not just to meetings since the causes are the service-oriented experiences that speak to what the Rotary is all about.
