There are two main ways that the coins are used to raise funds. Some coins are repatriated to their homeland when taken back by Aussie travellers or by other means. Only 15 major currencies are repatriated and then only coins above a certain value. If you are planning a trip overseas check with Hornsby Club and you may be able to obtain some discounted currency. 
