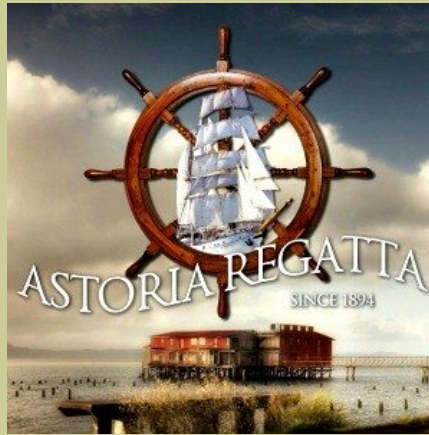

Astoria Regatta Grand Land Parade & Purely Social

Saturday, August 10



Lord High Chancellor Kimberly Bow n and Squire Stephen will lead the Royal Rosarians in the Astoria Regatta Grand Land Parade on Saturday, August 10. This parade is one of the easier ones, going six blocks west on Exchange Street, a block to Duane Street, then six blocks east to the finish. All Rosarians should be at the assembly area no later than 11:00 a.m. The assembly area is the School District "Old Bus Barn Area" located on Exchange St at 18th Street behind the Aquatic

Center.

Celebrating the return of Astoria fishermen from Alaska aboard boats filled with salted fish, the Regatta was started in 1894 making it one of the oldest festivals west of the Rockies. The Regatta now celebrates the entire Lower Columbia area to include all of Clatsop County, including Knappa, Warrenton, Gearhart, Seaside, Cannon Beach and everywhere in between.
