Northwest Festival Hosting Group



A big part of the Royal Rosarian experience is participating at an out-of-town festival in the Northwest. The weekend typically includes banquets, hospitality rooms, marching in their parade, a Rosarian Rose Planting Ceremony, other fun activities and best of all, making new or visiting with old friends. In 2019 the Royal Rosarians will visit eight out-of-town festivals starting with the Wenatchee Apple Blossom Festival in May and winding up in Leavenworth in

September at the Washington State Autumn Leaf Festival. There are hundreds of festivals in the Northwest so how are the ones we visit selected? They are all members of the Northwest Festival Hosting Group (NWFHG) which Portland has been a part of since the beginning.

The Northwest Festival Hosting Group was formed with eight original members in 1981 with the purpose of promoting member festivals, resource sharing between members and to enhance the quality and attendance level of the members' festival events. The organizational structure of members varies with each festival. Some have one group which plans and finances their festival and another to host the out-of-town festival guests. Others have one group do both. Portland is unique with three groups making up the Rose Festival delegation; the Rose Festival Association representing the festival, the Portland Rose Society promoting the growing and showing of roses and the Royal Rosarians as the hosting group for the Rose Festival and Ambassadors for Portland. Membership reached a high of 16 festivals in 1992, and currently has nine members.

NWFHG membership has certain required elements. The festivals are located within British Columbia, Idaho, Oregon and Washington. Member festivals must not occur on the same dates as other member festivals. Each festival must have a parade and a weekend hosting packet. Each member will send an official representative to each member festival, and visiting delegations will provide a float, marching unit or other entry to participate in the host parade. Each visiting member is given the opportunity to promote their festival while visiting. Hosting activities are held the Friday-Sunday during a festival although a festival typically runs longer.

Rotating among member cities, an annual conference is held in January with specific goals and business to accomplish. This year the conference was hosted by the Spokane Lilac Festival in Spokane January 18-20. The Royal Rosarians hosted the conference in 2012 and is scheduled again in 2022. Besides the official delegation from a member festival, any individual member of a NWFHG festival may attend.

Lord High Chamberlain Mike Ware is responsible for out-of-town festivals. He attended the NWFHG conference and has information on each of the festivals. For some of the festivals there may be a specific chair assigned. If planning on attending an out-of-town festival register early for the hosting package and hotel accommodations as there is often an early bird price and hotel space may fill up for some of the more popular festivals. Prime Minister Don plans on having transportation to some of the festivals and will be announced at a later date.

Hospitality packets are generally the same for each festival. There may be some variations in excursions, events or meals. There will be a Royal Rosarian rose planting ceremony at each festival. A festival packet will often have a early registration rate which will go up after a certain date.

The following articles cover each of the individual member festivals. They are listed in chronological order and a link to either the festival or hosting website is provided for further information or online registration.

Washington State Apple Blossom Festival

Wenatchee, WA, May 3-5

The hosting season kicks off with the Washington State Apple Blossom Festival in Wenatchee. With the theme "The Party Never Ends," the Apple Blossom Festival is celebrating its centennial anniversary this year. Sir Knight Morris Westlund, who claims to have been there for the first festival, is the chair for the Royal Rosarian visit.

The Washington State Apple Blossom Festival, originally called "Blossom Days", was founded as a one-day festival in 1919 to celebrate the importance of the apple industry to the region. Following World War II, the festival was renamed the

Washington State Apple Blossom Festival to more accurately reflect the importance of the apple industry in North Central Washington. Held during the last days of April and early May, the festival has grown to eleven days.

The Wenatchee Applarians is the hosting and goodwill organization for the community and host for the hospitality weekend, May 3-5. The hospitality packet is \$300 for a couple and \$175 for a single. The packet covers access to the



hospitality suite, the Queen's Ball on Friday, breakfast on Saturday, seating for the parade if not marching and the "100th Jubilee Derby" Saturday night. The registration deadline is April 5.

The host hotel is the Coast Wenatchee Center Hotel and has a festival special room rate of \$119 per night. Ask for the "Applarian Block" when booking. Hotel reservations are not included in festival packets so hotel reservations must be made separately. For the more popular festivals the reserved blocks may sell out so book early.

Registration for the hospitality package is by a mail application which will soon be available through the Royal Rosarian website calendar. Spokane Lilac Festival



Spokane, WA, May 17-19

Spokane and the Lilac Festival is the destination for the second out-of-town trek. The Lilac Festival's mission statement is "Honoring Our Military, Empowering Our Youth, and Showcasing Our Region." Started in 1938 by the Associated Garden Clubs and Spokane Floral Society to showcase the area's beautiful spring flowers and the area's youth, the festival is now a week of festivities in May combining the city's famous lilacs with events that culminate in the nation's largest Armed Forces Torchlight Parade.

Hosting weekend is May 17-19. The hosting group is a committee of the festival's managing organization. Planned is the Queen's Luncheon and Lilac Festival Gala on Friday. Saturday has the Rosarian Rose Planting Ceremony and the Armed Forces Torchlight Parade that evening. There is a farewell breakfast on Sunday. The hospitality room will be open on Friday and Saturday. The guest package is \$280 for a couple and \$140 for singles. There is an early bird special if you register before March 15 at \$250/\$130. The host hotel is the Davenport Hotel with a rate of \$165 for Lilac Festival guests.

New Westminster Hyack Festival

New Westminster, B.C., May 24-26

The end of May is our visit to the Hyack Festival in New Westminster, British Columbia. The Royal Rosarians and the Hyack Festival have had close ties over the years. In recognition of the assistance we gave them as they developed the Hyack Festival the President of Hyack Festival Association attends the Royal Rosarian Prime Minister's Ball to present a gavel to the incoming Prime Minister. The 2019 Hyack Festival President, Lili De Capite will present incoming Prime Minister Kimberly with the gavel at the ball on September 14.



New Westminster was selected as the first capital of the new colony of British Columbia and officially named by Queen Victoria after her favorite part of London. The official naming by the Queen gave New Westminster its nickname "The Royal City" and recognition for being the first city in Western Canada.

The word Hyack is from the Chinook Indian dialect and means "quick" or "fast". New Westminster's volunteer firemen were a lively lot back in the 1860's, so they called themselves the Hyack Fire Company.

Activities for the hosting weekend include a reception and formal banquet on Friday, International Parade, luncheon, Rose Planting Ceremony, artillery firing and Heritage Masquerade Ball/Dinner on Saturday and a Farewell Breakfast on Sunday. The Hospitality Suite will be available throughout the weekend.

The package is \$390 (CDN) for couples and \$195 (CDN) for singles. Registration can be done online by clicking the link below. The host hotel is the Inn at the Quayside. Ask for the "2019 Hyack Festival Block" when making a reservation. Room rates start at \$144 (CDN).

Portland Rose Festival



June 6-9

There will be much more in future issues, but the highlights will be; Honorary Knighting, Queens' Garden Party and Fun Night on Friday; Coronation of the Queen of Rosaria, Grand Floral Parade and the Grand Floral Ball on Saturday; Sunday concludes with the Farewell Breakfast and the Placement of the Queen's Plaque.

Marysville, WA June 14-16

Barely recovered from the "Fiesta of Roses" it's time to head north to the Marysville Strawberry Festival. Since 1932 Marysville has celebrated their major crop, the strawberry.

The weekend activities will be the President's Reception and Formal Dinner on Friday, Rose Planting Ceremony, lunch at Tulalip Resort, Shortcake Eating Contest, and Evening Grand Parade on Saturday. The Hospitality Suite will be open Friday evening and Saturday.



The Early Bird package if registered by May 24 is \$145 per person. After May 24 it jumps to \$155, then \$165 after July 5. There is no online registration with the festival. You can access the registration form through the calendar on the Royal Rosarian website when available. The festival pricing for rooms at the official hotel, the Holiday Inn Express, is \$159. The hotel registration deadline is June1.

Capital Lakefair



Olympia, WA July 14-16

July brings Olympia's Capital Lakefair, the nearest outof-town festival. With just under a two-hour drive most Rosarians participate in the parade only. For the hosting packet there will be the President's Dinner and entertainment on Friday, a Rose Planting Ceremony, Grand Parade and Clam Bake on Saturday, and farewell breakfast on Sunday.

The package costs \$250 per couple or \$150 for singles. The Hotel RL Olympia is the official host hotel with a special room rate of \$115 available until June 27.

Seattle Seafair

Seattle, WA July 26-28

The Seattle Seafair began as a plan to celebrate Seattle's centennial in 1951-52. The Seattle area was without major league sports teams or the Seattle



Center. Thirsty for national recognition and attention, Seafair was designed to attract tourists and showcase marine events in keeping with Seattle's boast as the "boating capital of the world."

Seafair spans ten weeks with 75 sanctioned events attracting more than two million people. Some of the signature events are the 4th of July celebration, Pirates Landing, Torchlight Parade and Fleet Week

Hosted by the Seattle Seafair Commodores, Hospitality Weekend features a hospitality suite, Commandant's Formal Dinner, Festival Shrimp Boat, Rose Planting Ceremony, Torchlight Parade and a Festival Farewell Buffet.

The full weekend package is \$170 per person. The registration deadline is July 15 and can be made online on the Rosarian Calendar. The Seafair Host Hotel is the Executive Inn by the Space Needle. The special room rate is \$209. Use "Seafair Commodores" for the block rate. Hotel registration deadline is July 1.

Penticton Peach Festival



Penticton, B. C., August 9-11

In its third year as a member of the NW Festival Hosting Group, Penticton has quickly become one of the more popular destinations for a weekend of festival and fun. Located in B.C.'s beautiful South Okanagan Valley, Penticton has a great climate not only for peaches and other produce, it has also become the heart of wine

country with some 44 wineries within a 20-minute drive. Along with the usual hospitality activities of banquets, parade, Rose Planting Ceremony, hospitality suite and entertainment there is a wine and cheese reception and a choice of a wine tour, local craft brew tour or Float the Channel excursion.

The early bird full package is \$195 (CDN) per person until June1. From June 1 until the cutoff on July 15 the rate is \$200 (CDN). The host hotel is the Penticton Lakeside Resort on the shore of Lake Okanagan and next to Okanagan Lake Park where the festival's entertainment stage is located. One of the featured entertainment groups is Eagle Eyes, an Eagles tribute group.

Councillor Ilse Kindler is the chair for the Peach Festival and advises those interested to let her know as early as possible so she can ensure there are rooms available. The resort rooms will sell out early. You can register for the festival package via the link below or on the Rosarian calendar.




The Royal Bavarians is the hosting organization for the festival and city. The

package is \$270 per couple or \$135 for a single before August 27. After that the rates become \$290 and \$145. The Enzian Inn is the host hotel with a rate of \$195. Book early and use the group number 9528 for the festival rate. The rate may change as the hotel contract with the Royal Bavarians had not been finalized as of this writing. Royal Rosarian Traveling Float



For some ten years the Royal Rosarians have built and taken a traveling float to participate in local and out-of-town parades. Over the years the float has won a number of awards at different parades.

First built by Sir Knights Marv Schlabs and Gary Cornell, the float is redesigned and rebuilt each year by hard working Rosarians and friends. The float is funded by the Royal Rosarian Foundation. The

concept drawing shown here is the design by Prime Minister Don and will be the float this year.

The float is built by Rosarians and help is needed to get it ready for the first parade. Until complete, construction takes place in Hillsboro at My Binding Warehouse nearly every Saturday, 10am - 2pm. Painters, carpenters and just plain helpers are needed. The coffee is hot and donuts delicious. The work parties are announced in the Tuesday Report and are listed in the Rosarian Calendar online. The first out-of-town parade will be the Daffodil Festival's parade in Puyallip on Saturday, April 6. The Daffodil Festival is no longer a member of the Hosting Group so the Royal Rosarians will not participate in events other than the one parade.

Uniform Changes

At the November 19, 2018 Royal Rosarian Council meeting, the Council took action on several changes to the Uniform Specifications, as recommended by the Uniform Standardization Committee. Please be aware of the following changes, noted in bold below:

- Changes to section I. White Suit, 2nd paragraph and other sections.
- Both the day (short) and formal (long) skirts are optional for Dames to purchase
- C. Formal Skirt (optional for purchase)
- D. Day Skirt (optional for purchase)

- Changes to Section I. White Suit
 - A.Coat 11.Dames may have a coat tailored at the waist for a better fit as is appropriate for business attire, while adhering to all other jacket specifications.
 - Changes to section II. Accessories
 - C.Dames 4. Shoes White, closed toe and closed back pumps with heels up to 2 inches, no embellishments, will be worn with the day and formal skirt.
 - Changes to section IV. Green Uniform
 - D. Knights will wear a white shirt with the official Rosarian tie and Dames will wear a white, unadorned and collarless shirt with **an optional string of white** pearls and optional pearl earrings. **If worn, the string of pearls should be simple or plain and not exceed 18 inches.**

These changes take effect immediately. Compliance with the change in shoe color worn with skirts will be transitioned in as the bone color shoes are replaced over the next 1-2 years. All new members choosing to purchase day or formal skirts are expected to follow the white color shoe specification. The changes will be updated in the 2019-2020 roster that will be published in the fall.
